
Some people say: “God may exist for you, but He doesn’t exist for me.” Yet others doubt God’s existence, because of all the pain and suffering they see in the world. Still others believe in a god who set the universe in motion but subsequently has been uninvolved with it (Deism). I believe not only that God exists, but, also, that He has clearly revealed Himself. In the ensuing discussion, then, rather than present philosophical arguments for the existence of God (cosmological, teleological, moral, transcendental, etc.) in an attempt to justify bare theism, I will discuss various ways in which the God of the Bible reveals Himself, providing supporting scriptural texts as well as appealing to widespread human experience. My contention here is not that God’s existence can be conclusively proven by means of human reasoning, but that Christian theism and the larger Biblical worldview provide a coherent and compelling way of viewing reality.
